1952 written by Bill Trader. This version was recorded on June 10, 1958, at RCA's Studio B, [Nashville](#), while Elvis Presley was on leave from the [Army](#). The recording featured guitar by [Hank Garland](#), [Chet Atkins](#) and Presley, bass by [Bob Moore](#), drums by [D. J. Fontana](#) and [Buddy Harman](#) and piano by [Floyd Cramer](#) and backing vocal by the [Jordanaires](#), with the bass voice provided by [Ray Walker](#).

What Kind Of Fool Am I - Sammy Davis Jr

1962 - written by [Leslie Bricusse](#) and [Anthony Newley](#). This song was the inspiration for a [Gary Larson](#) cartoon depicting scientists examining human subjects with the caption "Yes, they're all fools, gentlemen... But the question remains, 'What KIND of fools are they?'".

April Love - Pat Boone

1957 music by [Sammy Fain](#) and lyrics by [Paul Francis Webster](#). It was written as the [theme song](#) for a 1957 [film of the same name](#) starring [Pat Boone](#) and [Shirley Jones](#) and directed by [Henry Levin](#).

Helped by the release of the film, "April Love" became a number-one hit in the United States for Pat Boone,^[1] and spent twenty-six weeks on the US pop charts (it spent 6 weeks at number 1).

Why Do Fools Fall In Love - Frankie Valley & The Four Seasons

1956 by American rock and roll band Frankie Lymon & the Teenagers ranked No. 314 on the *Rolling Stone* magazine's list of [The 500 Greatest Songs of All Time](#).

If You Gotta Make A Fool Of Somebody - Freddie & the Dreamers

1961 is a song written by [Rudy Clark](#) and first recorded by [James Ray](#) in 1961. In 1962, [the Beatles](#) began to perform the song at their gigs "we did a version of it because we thought it was such a wacky waltz. No one had a 3/4 number. And an R'n'B waltz, that was new! Manchester [beat group Freddie and the Dreamers](#) heard the Beatles play the song at [the Cavern](#) in Liverpool in September 1962, and soon began to incorporate it into their own act.

Poor Little Fool - Ricky Nelson

Sharon Sheeley wrote this song when she was 15 years old. She had met [Elvis Presley](#), and he encouraged her to write. It was based on her disappointment following a short-lived relationship with [Don Everly](#) of [The Everly Brothers](#). Sheeley sought [Ricky Nelson](#) to record the tune. She drove to his house, and claimed her car had broken down. He came to her aid, and she sprang the song on him. Her version was at a much faster tempo than his recording. The recording features the background vocals of the [Jordanares](#)

Chain of Fools - Aretha Franklin

1967 Written by Don Covay who had been asked by Jerry Wexler, producer with Atlantic Records, to create songs for [Otis Redding](#), Covay recorded a demo of "Chain of Fools", a song he had written in his youth while singing gospel with his brothers and sisters. Listening to the demo, Wexler chose to place the song with Aretha Franklin rather than Redding. It became one of her string of hit singles.

I Pity the Fool - Bobby Bland

1961 - Soul Blues

April Sun in Cuba - Dragon 1977

Fooling Yourself (The Angry Young Man) - Styx

The song was written by guitarist [Tommy Shaw](#). It was originally based on Shaw's initial perception of Styx keyboardist [Dennis DeYoung](#) — an "angry young man" who viewed the group's successes with a wary eye and grew angry or depressed with every setback. It was only in later years that Shaw began to see himself in the lyrics, and the song took on a more personal meaning to him.

The composition features a number of [time signature](#) changes. The intro and outro are performed in $\frac{6}{8}$ time, led by Shaw's acoustic guitar tracks and Dennis DeYoung's synthesizer melodies. The vocal sections of the song are in $\frac{4}{4}$. The instrumental features a synthesizer solo in $\frac{7}{4}$ time, before returning to $\frac{4}{4}$ for the final chorus. After a brief intro recap, there is a brief break with two measures of $\frac{5}{8}$ time, and then a return to the $\frac{6}{8}$ meter, with another synthesizer solo, before fading out.

written by [Michael McDonald](#) and [Kenny Loggins](#). Loggins released his version July 1978, 5 months later the Doobie Brothers released their version in 1979 and Aretha Franklin did a cover in 1980. Here are all three :-)

The [Rolling Stones](#) from their 1976 album *Black and Blue*

The Joker - Steve Miller Band

"**The Joker**" is a song by the [Steve Miller Band](#) from their 1973 album *The Joker*. More than 16 years later, in September 1990, "The Joker" reached number one on the [UK Singles Chart](#) for two weeks after being used in a TV ad for [Levi's](#), thus holding the record for the longest gap between transatlantic chart-toppers.

NEWS 1 - Stop AI before it's too late

An open letter has been published regarding the risks of continuing with AI in its current form. "these advanced new AI models could pose "profound risks to society and humanity,"

"We call on all AI labs to immediately pause for at least 6 months the training of AI systems more powerful than GPT-4. This pause should be public and verifiable, and include all key actors. If such a pause cannot be enacted quickly, governments should step in and institute a moratorium." The key point are:

- Earlier this month, the fourth version of Open AI's GPT program was released, which can engage with users in human-like conversation
- The open letter urging the pause was signed by more than 1,000 people, including some big names in AI
- EU police force Europol warned about the potential misuse of the system in phishing, disinformation and cybercrime

NEWS 2 - Social Media lawsuit

20 year old Bill Gates gives the opening address at the First Annual World Altair Computer Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, giving a talk about software piracy.

The first truly long distance telephone call (235 miles) was made by Alexander Graham Bell to his assistant Mr. Watson from Boston to New York City. The call lasted 90 minutes before the line failed.

The first e-mail virus called Melissa, caused widespread damage and was one of the fastest spreading viruses in history. Melissa was released into the wild on an early Friday morning and within three days would infect around 250,000 computers around the world.

Radio Shack introduced the TRS-80 Model 100, one of the first portable computers in a notebook-style form factor.

7	FUTURE TECH from the Innovation Hub - Smart Clothing

We are all familiar with the traditional handshake – a friendly gesture that is used to communicate a desire for social interaction. It is a traditional way to meet someone and share information, but the future of handshaking could be very different.

Researchers at the University of California have been working to develop a new generation of smart clothes that use sensors and integrated circuits to exchange data and activate devices. This technology is set to revolutionise invisible computing, and it could make the handshake a new way to instantly share information.

The way it works is simple. A person wearing smart clothes would be able to instantly transmit their contact information to someone else simply by shaking hands using a type of NFC. - Haptic garments for people with deafness
- Jackets with integrated heat capacity and thermostats

In my lifetime, I've seen two demonstrations of technology that struck me as revolutionary. The first time was in 1980, when I was introduced to a graphical user interface—the forerunner of every modern operating system, including Windows. The second big surprise came just last year. I'd been meeting with the team from OpenAI since 2016 and was impressed by their steady progress. In mid-2022, I was so excited about their work that I gave them a challenge: train an artificial intelligence to pass an Advanced Placement biology exam. Make it capable of answering questions that it hasn't been specifically trained for. (I picked AP Bio because the test is more than a simple regurgitation of scientific facts—it asks you to think critically about biology.) If you can do that, I said, then you'll have made a true breakthrough. I thought the challenge would keep them busy for two or three years. They finished it in just a few months.

Mahjong Solitaire - Game Music



Mahjong is a tile-based game that was developed in the 19th century in China and has spread throughout the world since the early 20th century. It is played by four players (with some three-player variations). There is also a solitaire version which is sometimes referred to as mahjong solitaire.

A puzzle is created in various shapes or formations and you must remove matching pairs until all the pieces have been removed.

The only rules are that the selected pieces must match and the pieces you select cannot be boxed in - meaning, they need to be able to move left or right without disturbing other tiles.

The game is won when all pairs of tiles have been removed from the board, and lost if the remaining tiles contain no exposed pairs.

The computer games often light up the pieces that can be selected... while you are learning (swipe to find settings 😊)
