A blues song written by Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller, originally performed by Elvis Presley in 1958

(B) Henry Mancini - Peter Gunn 1958

Peter Gunn was an American private eye television series, starring Craig Stevens as Peter Gunn with Lola Albright as his girlfriend, Edie Hart. The series aired from 1958- 1961. The series was created by Blake Edwards. The series is probably best remembered today for its music, including the iconic "Peter Gunn Theme", which was nominated for an Emmy Award and two Grammys for Henry Mancini.

Ben E. King - Stand By Me 1961

is a song originally performed in 1961 by American singer-songwriter Ben E. King and written by him, along with Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller, who together used the pseudonym Elmo Glick. In 2015, King's original version was inducted into the National Recording Registry by the Library of Congress, as "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant"

Booker T & the MG's - Green Onions 1962

"Green Onions" is an instrumental composition recorded in 1962 by Booker T. & the M.G.'s. Described as "one of the most popular instrumental rock and soul songs ever". The tune is a twelve-bar blues with a rippling Hammond M3 organ line by Booker T. Jones that he wrote when he was 17.

David Bowie & Queen - Under Pressure 1981

It was played live at every Queen concert from 1981 until the end of the band's touring career in 1986.

Deniece Williams - Lets Hear it for the Boy (From Footloose) 1984

Fleetwood Mac - The Chain 1977

"The Chain" was created from combinations of several previously rejected materials, including solo work by Lindsey Buckingham, Stevie Nicks, and Christine McVie. The song was assembled, often manually by splicing tapes with a razor blade. Ironically, while they were splicing music together, their relationships were falling apart, Buckingham and Nicks were ending their years-long relationship at the same time that John and Christine McVie's marriage broke down, as did that of Fleetwood and his wife, Jenny Boyd

Free - All Right Now 1970

Apparently, All Right Now' was created after a bad gig. "We finished our show and walked off the stage to the sound of our own footsteps. The applause had died before I had even left the drum riser. It was obvious that we needed a rocker to close our shows. All of a sudden the inspiration struck Fraser and he started bopping around singing 'All Right Now'. He sat down and wrote it right there in the dressing room. It couldn't have taken more than ten minutes

Ian Dury & The Blockheads - Hit Me With Your Rhythm Stick 1978

Van Morrison - Brown Eyed Girl 1967

The song's nostalgic lyrics about a former love were considered too suggestive at the time to be played on many radio stations. A radio-edit of the song was released which removed the lyrics "making love in the green grass", replacing them with "laughin' and a-runnin', hey hey".

Pink Floyd - Money 1973

Queen - Another One Bites the Dust 1973

"Another One Bites the Dust" was used in a study to train medical professionals to provide the correct number of chest compressions per minute while performing CPR.[34] The bassline has close to 110 beats per minute, and 100–120 chest compressions per minute are recommended by the British Heart Foundation

Stevie Wonder - I Wish 1976

Stevie Wonder - Master Blaster (Jammin') 1980

The song, built on a heavy reggae feel, is an ode to reggae legend Bob Marley

The Blues Magoos - (We Ain't Got) Nothin' Yet 1966

Written by Ron Gilbert, Ralph Scala and Mike Esposito

The Clash - London Calling 1979

The Doors - Riders On The Storm 1971

The Four Seasons feat. Frankie Valli - December (Oh What A Night) 1975

The Jam - Town Called Malice 1982

The White Stripes - Seven Nation Army 2003

Written and produced by Jack White, the song consists of distorted vocals, a simple drumbeat, and a bass-like riff created by playing a guitar through a pitch shift effect. has become a sports anthem, commonly appearing in audience chants in which a series of "oh" sounds or the name of an athlete is sung to the tune of the song's riff. It has also served as a theme song for sports teams, personalities, and events, including the 2018 FIFA World Cup. The song has appeared in various media and has been used in political events in the United Kingdom, particularly as a chant sung by audiences. On May 9, 2014, during the celebration of the 825th Hamburg Port Anniversary, "Seven Nation Army" was played using the horns of cruise ship MSC Magnifica as it entered the harbor. In 2016, the White Stripes stated via Facebook that they were "disgusted" by the song's appearance in a video supporting Donald Trump's campaign for the 2016 United States presidential election, and they said that they "[had] nothing whatsoever to do with [the] video.

Last Time	Haptic Feedback

Haptic feedback is a mode of communication. It's a way for machines and humans to communicate.

iPhone Haptic Feedback

Your iPhone keyboard can make a sound or provide haptic feedback as you type in iOS 16 or later.

Turn iPhone **keyboard sounds** on or off (ticking noise)

1. Open the Settings app.
2. Go to Sounds & Haptics > Keyboard Feedback.
3. Turn Sound on or off.

Turn iPhone **keyboard haptics** on or off (vibration)

1. Open the Settings app.
2. Go to Sounds & Haptics > Keyboard Feedback.
3. Turn Haptic on or off.

If you've turned on keyboard haptics but you can't feel haptics when you're typing, make sure Vibration is turned on in Settings > Accessibility > Touch.

Android Haptic Feedback

Settings -> Sound and Vibration -> Vibration & Haptics

- Ring
- Vibrate then ring gradually
- Notification
- Alarm
- Touch
- Media (future interactive feature)

This Time	Battery percentage indicator

- Usually top right can show a picture (icon) and/or percentage
- Image changes to show charging
- Settings -> Battery (should show % and days/hours left)
- Select to open settings look for percentage toggle (on/off)
- While you're there look at other options and tweak e.g. Adaptive if available
- Battery saver schedule if needed
- Explore battery usage by app so you can see what's going on
- You can optimise usage by app by drilling down on the entry

3	NEWS 1 - Robo Dog

The New York Police Department (NYPD) is once again deploying Digidog, the four-legged robot that gained notoriety a few years ago. According to a recent report in The New York Times, the city faced backlash over the use of the robot, but Mayor Eric Adams has announced that Digidog can "save lives." Digidog, also known as Spot, is a remote-controlled robot made by Boston Dynamics, which is owned by Hyundai. It is designed to work in hazardous situations where humans may be at risk. Digidog can perform inspections in potentially dangerous areas and monitor construction sites. However, Boston Dynamics also promotes Digidog as a public safety tool, which the NYPD has tested in the past.

The reenlistment of Digidog by the NYPD has sparked a debate regarding the use of technology in law enforcement. Some people believe that robots like Digidog can be useful in keeping people safe, while others fear that these machines could be used to harm or oppress individuals.

In a statement, Mayor Adams defended the decision to deploy Digidog, stating that it is part of the NYPD's efforts to modernise its operations and enhance public safety. The robot will be used to investigate hazardous situations, such as hostage situations, chemical spills, and bomb threats.

STINGER	NEWS 2 - FAST TV for Google

If you haven't heard of FAST (free ad-supported streaming television) channels, you're missing out on a booming trend in the world of streaming. This means more options, more content, and all at no extra cost. With the addition of these new channels, Google TV is positioning itself as a serious contender in the world of streaming. STINGER**NEWS 3 - Check your reviews**

The Federal Trade Commission has taken its first step towards cracking down on what has been called “review hijacking” on Amazon.

The practice involves a company repurposing reviews from another product in order to deceive potential buyers. The FTC has fined The Bountiful Company, (the makers of Nature’s Bounty vitamins and other supplements) \$600k, for artificially inflating the number of reviews and ratings their products received on Amazon.

The FTC alleges that Bountiful abused Amazon’s variations feature, which allows sellers to merge products into a single listing when offering different colours, sizes or quantities of the same item. By creating multiple variations of the same product, Bountiful was able to give the appearance that their products had a higher number of reviews and ratings.

This led to their products being labelled as “#1 Best Seller” or “Amazon’s Choice”, further misleading potential customers.

STINGER**NEWS 4 - AI Alibaba**

Alibaba, the Chinese technology giant, has announced its plans to launch its own artificial intelligence (AI) chatbot called Tongyi Qianwen. This chatbot will be similar to the popular ChatGPT-style product and will be integrated across Alibaba’s businesses in the near future. Although no timeline has been provided by the company, it is expected that it won’t be too far off.

Generative AI chatbots have been making waves in recent months, with various technology companies launching their own versions. Earlier this year, Alibaba revealed that it was working on its own rival to ChatGPT. With the announcement of Tongyi Qianwen, Alibaba has entered the chatbot arena with a bang.

Tongyi Qianwen roughly translates to “seeking an answer by asking a thousand questions” in English, although the company has not provided an official English version of the name. The chatbot will be capable of working in both English and Chinese, and will initially be added to DingTalk, Alibaba’s workplace messaging app. It is expected that Tongyi Qianwen will eventually be integrated across Alibaba’s businesses, including its e-commerce platforms and digital payment service, Alipay.

STINGER**NEWS 5 - Italians no-lika-da Chat-GPT**

Italy has become the first Western country to block the use of advanced chatbot ChatGPT, citing privacy concerns. The model was created by US start-up OpenAI and backed by Microsoft, and has been a popular tool for millions of people since its launch in November 2022. ChatGPT is unique because it can answer questions using natural, human-like language, while also being able to mimic other writing styles using the internet as its database. However, the Italian data-protection authority has raised concerns about the privacy implications of using such a tool.

The regulator has announced that it will ban and investigate OpenAI “with immediate effect”. This move comes as a blow to Microsoft, which has invested billions of dollars into ChatGPT and recently added it to its search engine Bing. It had also announced plans to embed a version of the technology in its Office apps, including Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook.

The decision by Italy’s data-protection authority is likely to prompt questions about the use of advanced technologies and the balance between technological advancements and privacy concerns. While ChatGPT is undoubtedly a powerful tool, it raises important questions about who has access to our personal data and how it is being used.

OpenAI has confirmed that it complied with privacy laws, but it remains to be seen how other countries will respond to the use of chatbots like ChatGPT. The technology is rapidly evolving, and it's clear that there will be more debates about privacy and ethics in the years to come.

1983

John Sculley is named president and CEO of Apple Computer after Steve Jobs convinced him to leave his position as president of PepsiCo.

Almost exactly 2 years after joining Apple, John Sculley, asks Steve Jobs to step down as head of the Macintosh division at an Apple Computer board meeting. With the backing of the company's other executives, Jobs is stripped of nearly all responsibilities at Apple. While Jobs retains the title of Chairman, he has no authority and eventually leaves Apple.

1943

Researchers at the University of Pennsylvania begin work on the (ENIAC) Electronic Numerical Integrator and Computer, which when completed, would become the first general-purpose fully electronic computer, capable of making calculations one thousand times faster than any other prior computer.

1959

The business financial programming language COBOL (Common Object Business Operating Language) is conceived. Amazingly it is still used today... somewhere 😊

1992

Windows 3.1 was released selling 3 million copies over the next 2 months. This was the first actually successful release of Windows.

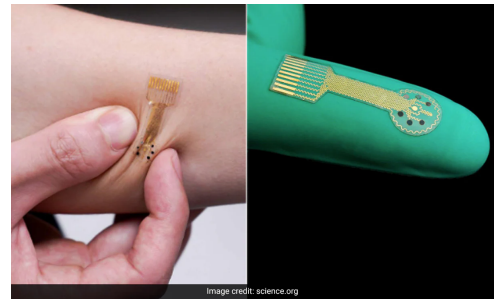

A smart patch that has been created by researchers can monitor healing, administer medicines to wounds, and use electrical signals to drive tissue growth.

This tiny gadget can provide immense benefits to those with burns, diabetic ulcers, and non-healing surgical wounds. The Smart Patch is wireless, biocompatible, mechanically flexible, stretchable, and skin-conformal, making it an ideal solution for patients with chronic wounds.



It consists of two parts: one reusable flexible printed circuit board and one disposable patch. The disposable patch contains biosensors, electrodes, and drug-loaded hydrogels.

The team headed by Dr Gao, have tested the smart bandages on diabetic mice and rat wounds, both before and after infection, discovering that the devices could detect characteristics such as the temperature, glucose levels, and pH of the wound fluid.

Gao quotes: "All the signals can be wirelessly sent to a user interface [such as] a computer or a cellphone," "We can wirelessly control the drug release by applying electrical potential."

Do I need to do every update every time it pops up?

Firstly, why have updates?

- Fix bugs, vulnerabilities
- Add features, make better use of new hardware, optimise or speed things up.

Often things stop working if you don't update as there is a knock on effect from all the parts that make up the whole. E.g. fixing a bug may need a new driver which stops your program working until you update it.

Answering the question

Depends.

If you know what the update is about (google it) then you may be able to make an informed decision if it's mandatory or optional.

Typically it's difficult to know, so it's safer to just do it.

In any case, you will generally be forced to update, otherwise things will just not work. Windows typically forces updates - although you can often postpone for a time.

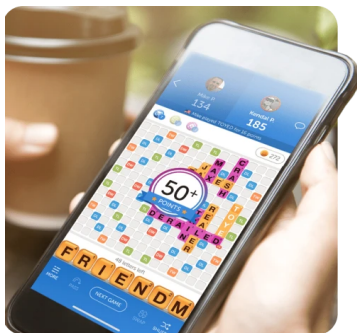
