Hot on the heels of Italy's banning of Chat GPT, EU lawmakers have gathered to propose a new AI act which would look at various means of regulating the development and implementation of AI technologies. In an open letter, members of parliament called for international cooperation in developing what they are terming guardrails on the development of AI tools.

In the open letter, lawmakers acknowledged that while the AI Act is directed at high-risk AI use cases, "we also need a complementary set of preliminary rules for the development and deployment of powerful General Purpose AI systems that can be easily adapted to a multitude of purposes."

This comes after much controversy and unrest in the AI space following the first open letter from the top bods last month, asking for a 6 month slow-down of all things AI.

STINGER NEWS 2 - Less and less TikTok by the day

Governments worldwide continue to express serious concerns over the safety of user data on TikTok, the popular social media platform owned by Chinese company ByteDance. Just last week, Australia and New Zealand joined the growing list of naysayers, prohibiting its use on government issued devices... but this all began long ago, India banned the platform in mid-2020, as part of a broader crackdown on Chinese-owned apps, citing concerns that user data was being transmitted to servers outside of India. This ban cost ByteDance one of its biggest markets, and since then, more than two dozen states in the US have banned TikTok on government-issued devices, with many colleges blocking the app from campus Wi-Fi networks. Now, Montana legislators approved a bill on Friday that would ban TikTok from being offered in the state by preventing the app from being available to install from the app stores.

While the app has been banned for three years on US government devices used by the Army, the Marine Corps, the Air Force, and the Coast Guard, these bans do not typically extend to personal devices. As a result, students often just switch to their personal phones to access the app.

So, what is the concern with TikTok, and why are governments taking such drastic steps to block it? The concern centres around the safety of user data, as TikTok collects vast amounts of information about its users, including their location, device information, and browsing history. There are fears that this data could be accessed by the Chinese government, potentially endangering national security.

Question: Doesn't Google and Facebook and every other social media app do this too?

STINGER NEWS 3 - Hungry?

DoorDash Air: Are you tired of waiting for your food to arrive? Do you want your groceries delivered as soon as possible? Well, the future of food delivery is here, and it's called DoorDash Air.

DoorDash Air is a new service that comes via a partnership with DoorDash, drone company Wing, and shopping centre giant Mirvac. The service has launched in Queensland and covers households in a dozen or so suburbs for now. Wing has also established a hub for drone deliveries at Mirvac's Orion Springfield Central shopping centre in Ipswich.

The new operations centre makes it possible for local restaurants and retailers using DoorDash's platform and Wing's delivery drones to send food and essentials to households further afield.

It's a very small group of people that immediately benefit from this severely gimmicky opportunity, but it's a sign of the future. A future where drones deliver food and...look, it's super cool.

Drones can carry a payload of up to 1kg and travel at speeds up to 110km/hr.

The service is expected to expand to other areas in the near future



Minesweeper is a logic puzzle video game featuring a grid of clickable squares, with hidden "mines" scattered throughout the board. The objective is to clear the board without detonating any mines, with help from clues about the number of neighbouring mines in each field.

Minesweeper was popularised by Microsoft in the 1990s in early versions on Windows but it stemmed from an adaptation of the 1983 version of Mined-Out on the Spectrum ZX computer.

Players click on a blank cell and when uncovered will show either a mine (BANG), a number indicating the number of adjacent mines or remain clear indicating there are no adjacent mines. If you think a cell contains a mine you can mark it with a special mine marker of which you only have a limited supply.

It's quite strategic and you can time yourself and challenge your friends.

Written by Wayne Brathwaite, Barry Eastmond, Mutt Lange and Ocean, the song was used as the theme song for the Michael Douglas and Kathleen Turner film The Jewel of the Nile (1985), a sequel to Romancing the Stone.

Isaac Hayes - Theme From Shaft (1971)

The song was considered very racy for its time. As late as 1990, censors at the Fox Network thought it too risqué to be sung on The Simpsons (until it was pointed out that the song had been played on television before).

Tina Turner - We Don't Need Another Hero (1984)

"We Don't Need Another Hero (Thunderdome)" is a song written by Graham Lyle and Terry Britten, and recorded by American singer Tina Turner. It appeared in the 1985 film Mad Max Beyond Thunderdome, which starred Mel Gibson and Turner.
